Position Statement

FSPHP Position statement regarding Ethyl Glucuronide (EtG) testing for ethanol consumption in program participants:

- 1. EtG is a highly sensitive, direct metabolite of alcohol.
- 2. EtG is undergoing additional research in regard to appropriate clinical use and interpretation.
- 3. EtG is a valuable urine testing tool for alcohol exposure.
- 4. EtG is not recommended to be used as a sole indicator of relapse. It must be correlated with clinical and ancillary data.
